Q1 Do you approve or disapprove of President Donald Trump's job performance?

Approve 8%
Disapprove 88%
Not sure 4%

Q2 How likely would you say you are to vote in the caucuses for President next time: are you certain to vote, will you probably vote, are the chances 50/50, or will you probably not vote?

Certain to vote 80%
Will probably vote 20%
The chances are 50/50 0%

Q3 Will you be voting in the Democratic caucus or the Republican caucus?
